Submission: Share your visual story of 1-10 (Hi-res, maximum 8Mb per image) photographs, archival images, illustrations-hand drawn or digital, GIFs and a short write-up (up to 300 words) through a dropbox link(preferred) at poshali@sprf.in.

Deadline for Submission: 31st March, 2021

Note: Photographs can be either from a professional or a phone camera. However, pixelated photographs and scans will not be considered.
